



I invite you to explore our **Roadmap to Growing Together**, a comprehensive framework to address food security, housing, transportation, education, and community engagement. Whether sharing your time, talents, experiences, or gifts, there is an opportunity for everyone to get involved and help our community grow and thrive together.

Food Security

Create greater flexibility in meeting individual and family needs for accessing food.

1. Engage and train volunteers to deliver food to neighbors in need.
2. Increase food supply through greater collaboration with churches and local businesses.
3. Assess need and ability to expand food access.
4. Expand SWEEP into Solanco High School.



WAYS YOU CAN HELP

- Volunteer to deliver food once a month.
- Host a food drive where you live, work, or worship.
- Donate food.
- Make a one-time or monthly monetary donation so we can purchase what we need, when we need it.
- Like data entry? Give us a call.



Educational Programming

Expand programs to address timely topics relevant to client and community needs.

1. Ask our neighbors what topics are of greatest interest to them.
2. Make resources and programming more visible and easier to access on the SNM website.
3. Expand virtual programming to include educational videos and programs for homebound neighbors.
4. Expand financial counseling/literacy programs to varied days, times, and formats.

Transportation

Provide enhanced access to affordable transportation.

1. Compile in-house statistics and area demographics to determine transportation needs.
2. Decide scope of SNM transportation services for 2026–2028.
3. Create a volunteer drivers' network.
4. Create a "Wheels of Hope" program to make affordable car repairs and loaner/ permanent cars accessible to neighbors.

Build better, stronger personal connections with community, churches, and local organizations.

1. Learn more about our volunteers' interests and skills
2. Formalize & promote Church Liaison Program.
3. Establish satellite locations for services, resources.
4. Increase accessibility to SNM for Spanish-speaking families.

3. Develop relationships with property owners willing to provide housing to clients.
4. Discuss whether to create, buy, or lease property to provide short-term housing for clients.
5. Advocate for affordable housing.





9/2/2024 - 9/30/2025





SNM works with Hostetter & Hostetter accounting to participate in a biannual review. Its most recent financial review found an expense breakdown of 80-10-10.



**An acceptable program expense percentage for a small nonprofit is generally 65-75% or higher, with a target of 70% or more for a strong rating. This benchmark is recommended by Charity Navigator and the Better Business Bureau.*

ENDOWMENT

(\$924,083 as of 9/30/2025)

SNM strives to be good stewards of the gifts it receives. We partner with Everence Financial to ensure donations are invested wisely into funds that are both fiscally and ethically responsible.






As part of its capital campaign in 2021, SNM had a goal of establishing an endowment fund. Its purpose is twofold:

1. Provide for the long-term financial health and sustainability of the ministry.
2. Provide investment earnings that can be put back into the ministry to support the mission, outreach, and programmatic goals outlined in our strategic plan.

Ways to Give

You can also donate a gift of stock, make a charitable donation from your IRA, participate in employer giving programs, or leave the ministry in your will.

Charitable Gifts of Stock

Giving the gift of appreciated stock is a great way to help the ministry. Gifting stocks to non-profits helps you avoid capital gains tax on the appreciation of the stock and is tax-deductible for the full market value of the securities on the date of the donation.

To donate a gift of stock, call the ministry or have your broker give us a call.

Required Minimum Distribution

The IRS requires you to withdraw at least a minimum amount of money from some types of retirement accounts, starting the year you turn 72. This is called a Required Minimum Distribution. By making a qualified charitable distribution to the ministry, you can reduce your taxable income.

Workplace Giving

Payroll deductions, matching gifts, and volunteer grants are just some of the ways your employer may encourage and support your gift to a qualifying non-profit organization.

Legacy Giving

Death is not a topic most people enjoying thinking about, but there is peace in knowing your affairs are in order and that which is personally meaningful to you will be taken care of. You can have lasting impact in your community by including Solanco Neighborhood Ministries in your will.
